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FROM THE ACTING PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Friends, Staff and Students of Caroline Chisholm College,

ANZAC Ceremony

We recently observed ANZAC Day and this took two forms at the college. On ANZAC Day itself, 75 students proudly represented the college in what has become an annual tradition, at the Warragamba ANZAC Day March. It was very impressive to see so many girls turn out on the last day of their

holidays, smartly presented in their uniforms, to honour the service men and women who have and

continue to serve their country. Many of the girls wore the medals, both originals and replicas, of relatives who had been in conflicts while serving in the armed forces. The medals ranged from World War I to Iraq with just about all theatres of war represented in which Australians were involved. There were medals from World War II, Vietnam and even the Malayan Emergency in the 1950s. Some of the students marching have parents and relatives who are currently serving. Thanks to **Ms Dunne** for her work in preparing the students for this occasion.



On Friday, as part of our regular college assembly, we had an ANZAC Ceremony, organised by **Ms Thompson** and HSIE students. As a preamble to acknowledging the men and women who served Australia in the defence forces, time was also give to reflect on the enormous contributions made by Australians outside the armed forces to support our service men and women, in such capacities as food production, manufacturing and entertainment of troops. I was struck by the way we were given a fresh perspective and this was invaluable to the students. It is important that while we maintain traditions, such as commemorating ANZAC Day, we should not be just going through the motions – we should pause and reflect, each time thinking a little more carefully and deeply about what we are commemorating.

Year 12 Reports

Year 12 students were given their Term 1 reports this week. In reading through the reports I was impressed by the work, effort and achievement of so many of the students. In many cases, their commitment goes beyond academic achievement to their enormous contributions to the broader life of the college in their leadership and involvement in so many activities. I would also commend the efforts and honesty of their teachers in their reporting of the students' progress. For all students this is a time, in the words of **Mr MacNamara**, the Year 12 Leader of Learning, to "read [the reports], reflect and respond". For some students, there is some substantial responding which needs to occur. There is time to make significant changes to their commitment to their final HSC achievement – but not much. They need to be working closely with their teachers and acting on their advice.

Year 11 and 12 Vaccinations

Year 11 and 12 students will have a one-off vaccination for various strains of meningococcal on **Tuesday 16 May**. Students have already received a permission form. I would ask that they be returned as soon as possible. They can come by the day of the vaccinations but we would prefer them before that for organisational purposes. It is important that students come to school on the day, even if they are a little unwell, as long as they don't have a fever. If they are unwell it is possible for them to be brought to school for the vaccine then go home.



"Doing the Right Thing Awards"

Students who provide service to the college for a variety of reasons are eligible for a "Doing the Right Thing Award". Year 7 and 9 NAPLAN

The five NAPLAN tests will take place on the following days next week:

All students are required to bring the following :

- 2B or HB pencil (or blue or black ballpoint pens)
- an eraser
- a sharpener
- a calculator, with full battery life for the Calculator Allowed Test on Thursday.

There has been a great deal of media coverage over the new HSC Minimum Standards for the class of 2020 and many students, particularly in Year 9 have started to show some concern and worry that they might not be eligible to complete the HSC. We want to reassure you that this will not be the case and that all our students in Year 9 will be eligible to do the HSC in 2020. Should any student in Year 9 not meet the Band 8 standard, then we as a college will work with those students to ensure that they are at that standard before the commencement of the HSC in 2020.

Mrs Lans and **Miss White** will speak to all of Year 9 at their Year Assembly this week regarding the new minimum standards to clarify any misunderstandings and hopefully alleviate any concerns. **Mr Mills** and the Year 7 Homeroom team will also clarify any questions with Year 7.

We encourage all our students to do the very best they can with their NAPLAN tests next week. The results present a snapshot of where each student is currently at with literacy and numeracy, information that will be useful to teachers to develop the next steps in their planning of teaching and learning.

Year 10 Half Yearly Exams

Year 10 Half Yearly exams will take place from Monday 22 May to Friday 26 May. Students received a copy of the exam timetable via their email this week.

We are giving Year 10 students the opportunity to go home at the end of their final exam on each day. This is a privilege we currently offer to our Year 11 and 12 students and are now offering to our Year 10 senior students. The aim of this is to prepare your daughters for the exam period structure they will experience in their Preliminary and HSC courses.



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Students who have an exam in the morning and then in the afternoon block will still be required to remain at school to study. They will not be permitted to leave the school grounds. Supervision will be provided for these students and a room made available for them to revise. Supervision will also be provided for those students who choose to stay at school until the end of the normal school day.

Please complete the permission slip on the letter sent out on Monday and return it to your daughter's homeroom teacher by **Monday 8 May**. Students who do not return the permission slip below by the due date will not be able to leave early and will need to stay at school. Normal classes resume for all Year 10 on **Monday 29 May**.



Advice to Year 7 Parents RE: Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccination in 2017

In previous years the HPV vaccine course has been given over a 12 month period. However, in 2017, the second dose of the HPV vaccine will be delayed until later this year to accommodate the introduction of the Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination Program for students in Years 11 and 12.

Scheduling the HPV course in this way will not reduce the effectiveness of the vaccines.
